Introduction

The Journal on African Democracy and Development is an open access journal intended to promote the growth of African scholarship by drawing analytical insights from mainly African scholars on governance and development issues on the continent. This was motivated by the desire to allow a new generation of African leaders, an opportunity to have their own agency in shaping the intellectual and governance landscape of the continent. The JADD covers a range of disciplines from development, art, science, democracy, management, international relations among others. The journal strives to be a leading platform for academicians, new researcher, development actors, and established authors on the African continent to promote their skills and African scholarship. It also strives to publish original and best quality work. The JADD is an initiative of the University Forum on Governance (UNIFOG) and the Konrad Adenauer Stiftung - Uganda (KAS) with two successful issues.

The JADD was established on the following objectives: (a). Advance the culture of analytical reflections on understanding the underlying contexts and conditions shaping Africa's political and governance development. (b). Promote scholarly development on the continent with the view of institutionalising knowledge production and usage. (C). Promote and strengthen the culture of African scholars working together thereby widening and consolidating the network of a new generation of African leaders that will be central to the political and economic development of the continent.

Candidates with successful abstracts will be notified and invited to present and discuss their abstracts before progressing to writing a full paper.
